We have always had a dream of having a large family. We would watch movies like cheaper by the dozen and think that having a big family like that would be a dream come true. I know to most of you this probably sounds crazy!

This dream was dashed when I was told after having Josiah, that we would not be able to have any more children of our own.

Ray and I talked about the possibility of adopting overseas but, the cost was prohibitive. When our family returned from overseas this past fall, we felt God had called us to pursue doing foster parenting with the <u>option</u> to adopt.

Ray and I went through a 7 month process of doing classes, taking tests, having home studies, and back ground checks done. In March we became licensed as foster/ adopt parents and within a few days received a phone call asking us to take a sibling group consisting of three very young children.

Our family prayed together about taking these three children into our home and all felt that God was saying yes, we were to take these babies in.

As many of you have probably added up the numbers, this makes us a family of 8! We feel so blessed to have had these children placed into our home while we continue our work with the ministry in Afghanistan. Now we are working on the mission field both overseas and here in our own backyard. James writes in the bible that the definition of true religion is to take care of the widow and to the orphan. This is what we endeavor to do on both sides of the world

These children have been a challenge at times but also reward us with lots of small victories, hugs and kisses. Having 6 kids under the age of 8 means allot of adjustments. God has done a huge work in their lives during this time they have spent with us but the bigger work has been accomplished in our lives. God has been so faithful to our family, providing the support when we need it and never letting us go without.

We don't know what the future holds but we do know that it is always full of adventure. – Julie Siebring

The First Complete Dari Bible

Twenty-five years ago, the Dari New Testament was published. Since then, thousands of Afghans have read the Gospels in their own Afghan Persian. However, for the Old Testament, they had to rely on Iranian publications, which was very difficult for many. In 2007, the Dari Psalms was printed and distributed. The Psalms was so well- received, it is already in its second printing.

Now, for the first time ever, the complete Dari Bible has been printed. After 20 years, with many ups and downs and many different people involved, the Dari Bible is ready for Afghans—a huge milestone for Afghanistan. Here is a quote from one Afghan who received a copy.

When I read the New Testament in the Dari language, I feel it belongs to me and is for me. The new full Bible in Dari is a great gift and tribute for me and my fellow countrymen. God also gave me the privilege to lead a person to the Lord. He had recently had a dream that someone would come and tell him the truth. He said, 'lt's amazing how I feel now. I think you are that person in my dream.'


Dear Family, Friends, & Partners,


